CASE-TO-CASE TRANSFER AS A LOGIC IN MIXED-METHODS RESEARCH

With Co-authors Anjali Verma, Black Hawk Hancock & Justin L. Sola

Concerns over interpretation, representation, and replication have sparked debates about the use of non-probability based data. One solution has been a mixed-methods study, where representative probability-based (quantitative) data answer some aspect of a question, while non-probability (qualitative) data illuminate mechanisms in greater detail. Assessing the validity of case-to-case transfer (C2CT), we find combining qualitative and quantitative observations is problematic even for similar cases.
